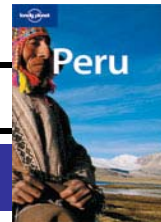

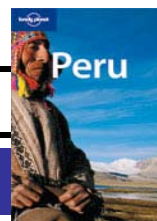

The archeological site Huaca Pucllana in Miraflores, Lima, is not admission free anymore.

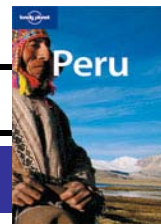

No I didn't pay attention to your Aguas Calientes town map... How wrong was I? If it wasn't for a police officer checking our tickets we would have had to spend the night there... 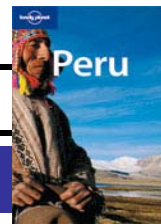

Wayna Picchu Machu Picchu: Entrance to Wayna Picchu is now restricted to 400 people per day. 200 are admitted at 7am and 200 at 10am but one needs to start queueing for a (free) ticket early to stand a chance. This seemed very new when we were there. Judging by the complaints it caused among tourists it may not last long in its current form.

Wayna picchu: you should mention that there are only 400 persons allowed a day on this mountain. 200 tickets to climb from 7-8 and 200 to climb from 10-11. Once you are up you can stay as long as possible but climbing occurs in the restricted hours that will be mentioned on your ticket if you managed to get hold of it.

Wayna Picchu. It may be useful to note that there is a limit of 400 persons a day who can visit this part. And it fills up pretty quickly. Quite a few people sign up early, and then come back later to actually go in, so if you want to go it's a good idea to sign up as soon as possible.

The price of the Caral tour on the last Sunday in the month has gone up to \$40 (120 soles). Also it appears that it is no longer possible to climb to the top of the pyramids (the stairs were cordoned off and the guides did not offer this possibility). By the way, Caral was the highlight of our trip -- we thought it was even more magnificent than Machu Picchu (perhaps they have improved it since your last update) and you should consider expanding your coverage of it.
