Getting ripped off on exchange rates when you need money is better than not being able to get money at all. Unfortunately many banks have taken to blocking ATM cards from working in places like Paramaribo where they think you have no business being. Be sure that you notify your bank before you leave where you're going and have a regular (not toll-free) number on which you can reach them in the event your card is blocked anyway. Fortunately I carry multiple ATM cards from multiple banks and one of them worked but two of my banks (despite prior notification) had blocked my ATM card from working in Suriname. One bank flat-out refused to enable it in Suriname insisting that their security was more important than me having access to my own money.

In Tumbes (Peru) we were lucky enough to avoid the following scam: The easiest way to cross the border to Ecuador seems to take one of the CIFA-buses who offer an international service. When arriving at the bus terminal taxi drivers approach tourists and offer to take them to the CIFA-terminal. What happens instead is that you are taken to an old CIFA-terminal which is no longer in use. After showing you the closed terminal the taxi / tricycle-driver will tell you that there is no service this day. Then they offer to take you to the border themselves for an inflated price. Actually there seems to be a whole gang of taxi drivers involved in this business. At times 5 - 6 tricycles were trying to convince us at the same time that they were working for CIFA and that there were no services this day. They even pretended to have the keys for the terminal building...

it would be really helpful to add a blurb about the somewhat complicated border crossing from Tumbes, Peru to Huayaquillas, Ecuador. It's one where taxi drivers can easily take advantage of travelers not knowing the details. (In S.A. on a Shoestring there is a bus company listed to get you from Tumbes to the border. They're closed in Tumbes now which may be why the crossing is more confusing.)The immigration office to get your stamp to leave Peru is some distance before the actual border and the Ecuadorian immigration office is a ways outside of town once you cross the border. And then after you get your stamp the buses leave from town, back in the direction you just came from. Cab drivers take you to Peruvian immigration and then ask for more money to the actual border, and then start in on how the Ecuadoran office is far away and they can be your guide there...for a fee. It's a hassle that doesn't need to happen if you know to negotiate the price to immigration AND the actual border up front. Then walk across the border, ask around for the bus office to where you want to go and buy yo
